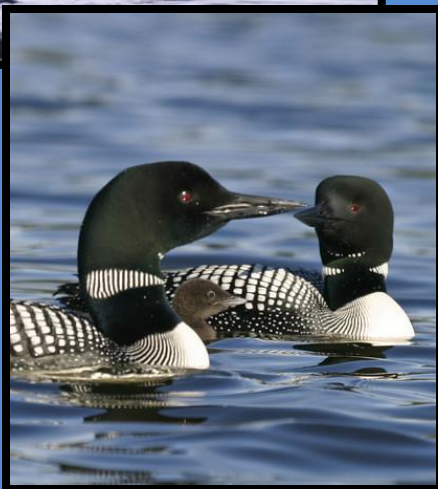


Loons - Our Most Welcomed Guests
